**BATTLE OF WATERLOO VISIT 16<sup>th</sup> JUNE – 19<sup>th</sup> JUNE**



Particularly as we are RSSG Waterloo branch Members may well wish to support a visit to commemorate this outstanding battle near the site itself, visiting Lion's Mound, commissioned as a memorial by the Netherlands King William 1. Visitors who wish may pay a fee to climb up the Mound's 225 steps, which lead to the statue and its surrounding overlook (where there are maps documenting the battle, along with observation telescopes); the same fee also grants admission to see the painting "Waterloo Panorama". In addition we will also visit the evening 8 o'clock, very moving, ceremony at the Menin Gate, Ypres, and lay a wreath on behalf of the Royal Society of St. George.

We will leave the Duke of Wellington pub (opposite the Union Jack Club) Waterloo after an optional lunch by executive coach on Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> June, for the late afternoon ferry to Calais for an overnight stop at the 3\* Brit Hotel Calais.

On day 2 we make our way to the Memorial 1815 and Lion's Mound, before making our way to our 3\* Novotel Ieper Flanders Fields Hotel in Ypres, where we will spend two nights.

The third day we have the day free to explore Ypres, where there are many Museums and the magnificent St. Martin's Cathedral. After an early dinner (cost not included) we walk the short distance to the Menin Gate for the Last Post ceremony.

On our last day we make our way by coach to Veurne, an old and elegant town, with a unique market square. In contrast to many other towns in the area Veurne was little damaged during the war and still possess a magnificent architectural heritage. We then return to Calais, finally arriving back at our starting point mid evening.

Subject to 30 people travelling Geoff has negotiated the total cost, including a buffet breakfast, of £369 per person sharing a twin or double room, with a £75 Single person supplement and Insurance (if required) of £37.

There is some urgency in booking this trip, in that the Hotels are holding rooms for our party only for a limited period, so please make contact soon, so that we can make a firm booking as soon as possible.
